Borough Policing News

As part of National Hate Crime Prevention Week officers took part in a mini road show and visited several prominent venues across the borough. Together with our partners from Stay Safe and Galop they engaged with an impressive 281 members of the public who all received advice and guidance on how to deal with and report Hate Crime.

While on patrol officers from the South Cluster Neighbourhood Policing Team came across two large boxes of unused 'Laughing Gas' which were hidden underneath a parked car in Ely Road E10, they also found further along the road a hidden cricket bat.

Recently the Community Payback team attended Abbots Park in order to clear up the location. This was overseen by the Borough Commander Richard Tucker who attended the venue to take a look at the project in action. Offenders worked to clean up their local area and at the same time the scheme gives officers the chance to change the attitude of the offenders breaking the stereotypes and barriers between the police and themselves.

Police spotted a known gang member driving a vehicle. He failed to stop when indicated to do so and tried to make off into the Oliver Close estate. He was pursued and detained and found in possession of class B drugs, a large quantity of cash along with several mobile phones which he attempted to discard. He was arrested and a search of his address found a further £2000, scales and several car keys. A search of the estate resulted in numerous vehicles being located and searched where a large amount of class A and B drugs were recovered.

Crimes of note & Prevention Advice

Burglary 11 OCT. along Cecil Road. Resident returned home to find rear first floor window had been forced open. Items of jewellery have been taken

Taking just a few steps can make a big difference in keeping your home safe from burglary. Here are a few tips:

Lock your doors and windows every time you leave the house, even when you're just out in the garden, remembering to double-lock UPVC doors (lift handle and turn key)
 Hide all keys, including car keys, out of sight and away from the letterbox (remember a device could be used to hook keys through the letterbox)
 Install a visual burglar alarm and good outside lighting
 Leave radios or lights in your house on a timer to make the property appear occupied
 Secure bikes at home by locking them to an immovable object inside a locked shed or garage
 Keep ladders and tools stored away; don't leave them outside where they could be used to break into your home
 Ensure side gates are locked to prevent access to the rear of the property
 Mark your property with postcode and house number and register your property for free with Immobilise.com
 Consider joining or forming a neighbourhood watch scheme
 Remove valuables from view of ground floor windows
 Store any high value items (i.e. jewellery, passports) in a properly secured safe or bank vault
